Overwhelming biblical support for female leadership and ordination

In this presentation, emeritus pastor and WA president, Ray Schulz, has drawn on his expertise in the discipline of 'Textual Criticism' to demonstrate what he regards as the overwhelming biblical support for female leadership and ordination. Ray has come to the conviction that especially in the 20th century the most influential textual critics have demonstrated a considerable bias against women in church leadership, by enhancing or even creating flimsy textual evidence to suit their perspective while ignoring the overwhelming counter evidence that clearly shows the case for female leadership.

In the presentation Ray has replaced the "in house" language of textual criticism with everyday English expressions. It should be noted that the term textual criticism by no means implies a critical attitude to the scriptures. Rather, it is the standard discipline whereby biblical scholars seek to determine the best form of the Greek text of the New Testament (and the Hebrew text of the Old Testament) as they study the countless variations within the transmitted manuscripts.
